

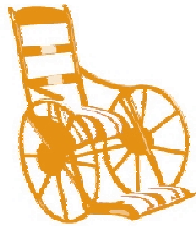

Our senses change significantly throughout the lifespan, but too often the design of our homes does not reflect this fact. The LIFEhouse™, a universally designed concept house, is a model residence, developed by UB's IDEA Center and a number of partners, that provides a model of a residence adapted to a person's changing needs throughout the course of a lifetime. The house and its site incorporate multisensory perception with universal design principles. LIFEhouse™ won the 2012 National Home Builder's Association Best Universally Designed Home Award.
